

### **Growing Tips**

- Planting container: use a water-tight container without drainage holes. If a container comes with drainage holes, plug them up;
- Place the container in a sunny spot;
- Soil: use soil made for pond plants or heavy topsoil or clay;
- Fill the container with a thin layer of soil then add enough water just to wet soil;

Gently place tuber on the surface of the wet soil;

Cover tuber with another layer of soil, about 4 inches, with growth tips pointing upwards. The growth tips should remain slightly above the soil with the rest of the tuber buried;

Cover the soil with a thin layer of sand or gravel to keep the tuber in place;

Fill with more water to cover the tuber above the tips;

Check water daily to make sure that the growth tips is covered with water at all times;

Areal leaves will start popping out;

• Once established, start fertilizing with granules 10-10-10 or 14-14-14
