



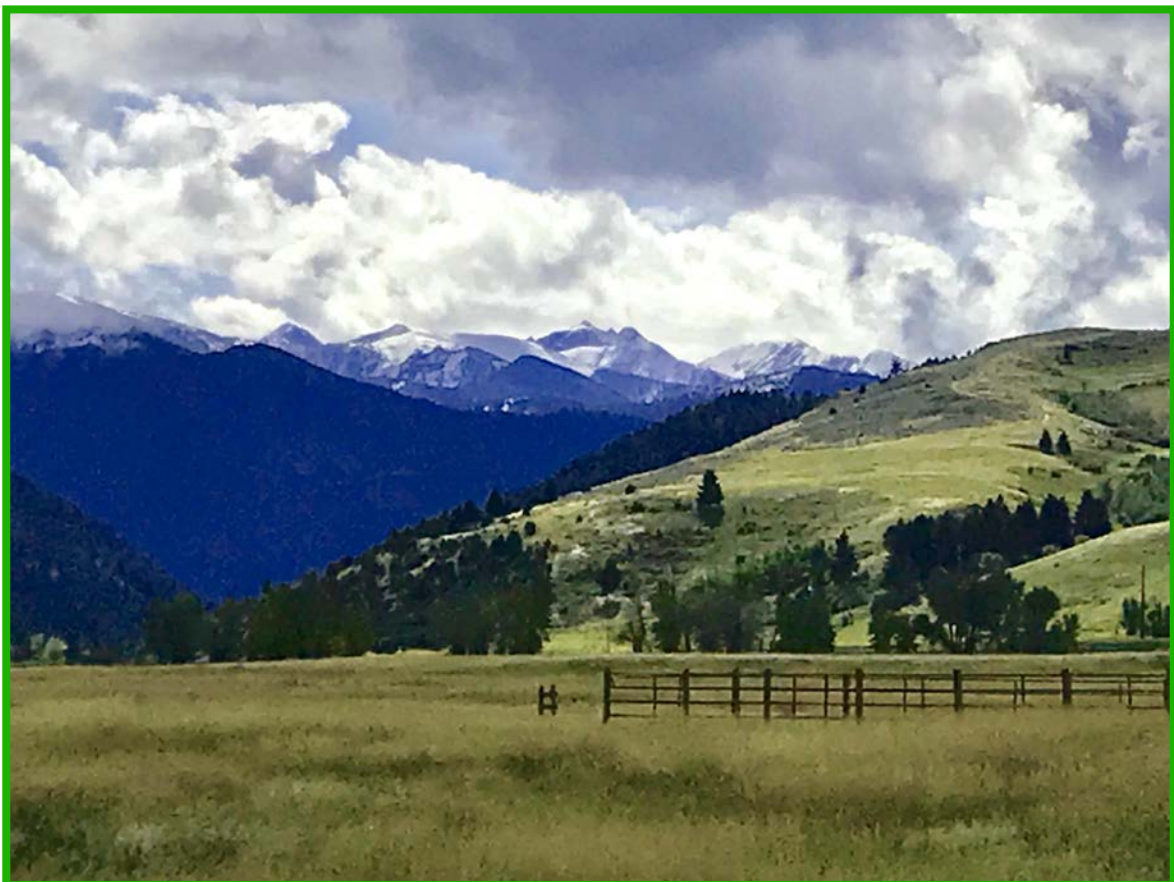

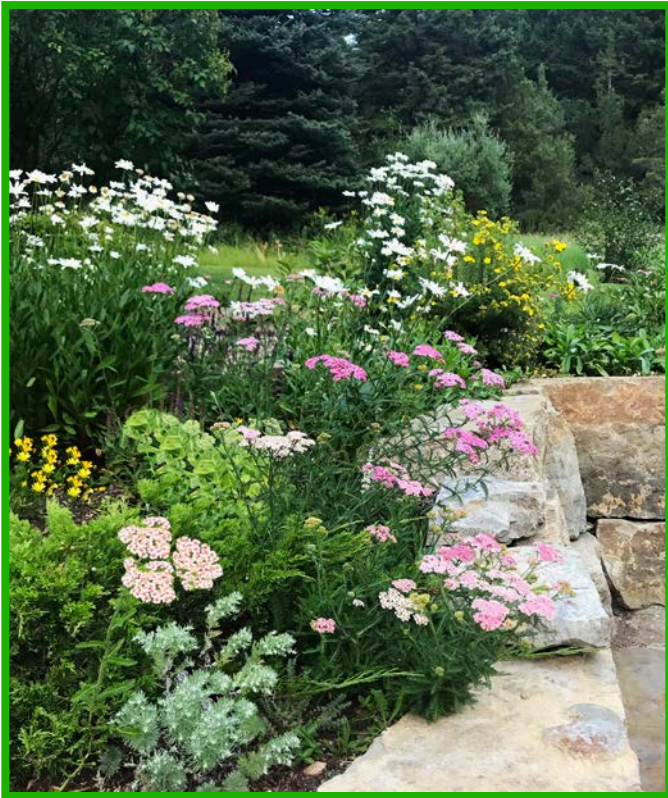

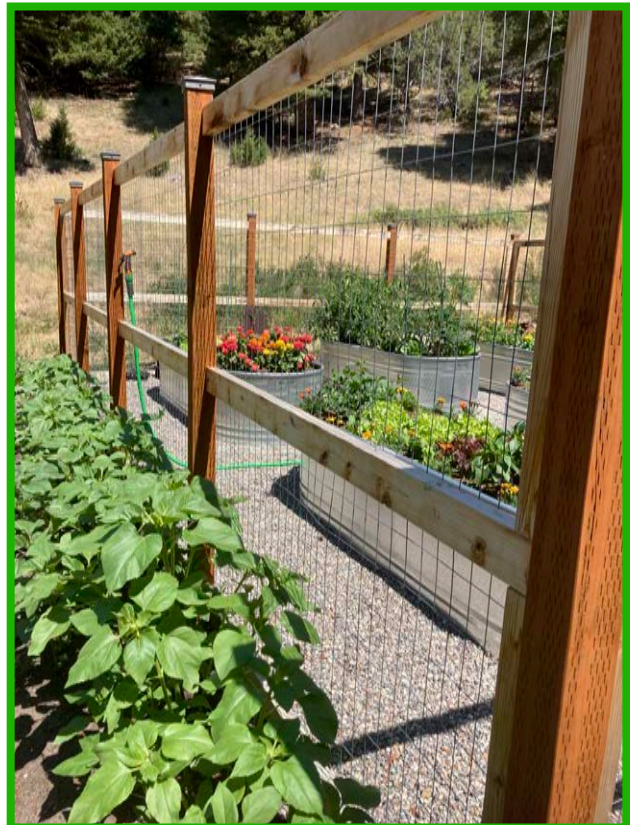

When asked how she keeps deer, rabbits, bears and other wild critters from salivating at her gardens, Mary writes:” We do have mountain lion which keep the deer at bay, the occasional bear, usually in the spring, but there’s a lot going on up here which seems to keep the animals hiding somewhere.”

“Most of what I’ve planted over the years is pretty much deer proof. The vegetable garden is fenced off, and I have a cutting garden there as well, with snapdragons, dahlias and the like.”

“We are surrounded on three sides by National Forest... The Gallatin River runs in front of the property. Ted Turner owns 175,000 acres across the river, all of which is in a conservative easement, so we are very protected from the overdevelopment that is going on out here.”
